Kwik Cricket Key Stage 1



Kwik Cricket is a fun introduction to cricket played with plastics bats, wickets and soft balls. It allows young people to develop cricket skills in a safe and fun environment. It is also played in Australia and New Zealand.

Target: Girls, Boys, disabilities and able bodied aged 5-7.

Background and Aims

- A safe and fun way to engage with a new sport
- Develop hand-eye coordination
- Take pupils from no cricket knowledge to playing mini games and ability to progress to playing cricket as a mixed team in a tournament.

Outline of Activities and Extensions

- This is a perfect activity for outdoors -on grass or playground but skills can also be practiced indoors
- Week 1: assessment and target setting
- Bat safety, control and playing shots
- Catching, throwing and fielding
- Bowling under -arm
- Week 6: evaluation and recommended progression
- Extension: catch and throw to a target.
- Extension: Overarm bowling.
- Extension: curriculum links (numeracy)

Curriculum Links covered

- Master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities
- Participate in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending

Outcomes

- Individual progression of new skills
- Improve teamwork, cooperation, trust and develop discipline.
- Improve hand-eye co-ordination, patience, concentration and control
